 Canada's largest oil and gas producer Canadian Natural Resources missed analysts' estimates for first-quarter
 profit, hurt by lower-than-expected production, along with a decrease in sales and realized pricing.

 Qualcomm on Wednesday forecast quarterly sales and adjusted profit above Wall Street expectations, driven by selling more and pricier chips into Android smartphones with artificial-intelligence features.

BEFORE THE BELL

Futures for Canada's main stock index rose supported by a rise in **oil** prices, which rebounded from sevenweek low as focus shifts to potential U.S. move to build up its strategic reserves. **Wall Street futures** advanced a day after the Federal Reserve left interest rates unchanged and allayed fears around potential rate hikes. Meanwhile, the **yen** backtracked after a suspected intervention-fuelled leap late on Wednesday, while the **Nikkei** tumbled. **Gold** prices fell on Fed indications that interest rates would stay high for longer and the **U.S. dollar** pared losses after retreating from near six-month highs. In **Europe**, **markets** were sluggish after a day off, while investors assessed a slew of earnings.

STOCKS TO WATCH

• Air Canada: The company reported a smaller first-quarter adjusted loss, as Canada's largest carrier benefited from a rebound in bookings for business travel. Executives at Air Canada's U.S. peers have highlighted expectations for robust travel demand across both domestic and international routes in the upcoming summer



season. The International Air Transport Association expects 4.7 billion people to travel in 2024, compared with 4.5 billion in 2019. Its adjusted loss narrowed to C\$96 million, or C\$0.27 per share, from C\$188 million, or C\$0.53 per share, a year earlier. The Canadian carrier's quarterly operating revenue rose 7% to C\$5.2 billion in the quarter ended March 31.

- Canadian Natural Resources Ltd: The company missed analysts' estimates for first-quarter profit, hurt by lower -than-expected production, along with a decrease in sales and realized pricing. The firm posted an adjusted profit of C\$1.37 per share, below analysts' average estimates of C\$1.48 per share. Net earnings were C\$987 million compared with C\$1.8 billion for the first quarter of 2023 due to lower realized synthetic crude oil (SCO) and natural gas pricing. Product sales came in at C\$9.42 billion, slightly below the year-ago quarter, with a nearly 39% drop in natural gas sales. Overall production came in at 1.33 million barrels of oil equivalent per day (boepd), lower than analysts' expectations of 1.35 million boepd. CNQ also saw a drop in its oil sands mines, coming in at 445,209 barrels a day, a decrease of 3% from year-ago levels, on planned and unplanned maintenance. It also said it would benefit from the starting up of the Trans Mountain Oil pipeline, in which it can move 94,000 barrels a day.
- Thomson Reuters Corp: The company beat first quarter revenue expectations, lifted its annual financial forecast and raised its annual dividend by 10% to \$2.16 as it continued to invest heavily in artificial intelligence. The news and information provider reported an 8% rise in first quarter revenue to \$1.88 billion, from \$1.74 billion a year earlier. Wall Street expected \$1.85 billion in the quarter. Operating profit, which Thomson Reuters said rose 10% to \$557 million, fell just short of expectations of \$559 million. Adjusted earnings per share, excluding one-time items were \$1.11 per share. The company raised its annual total revenue forecast as a result of its first quarter performance and now expects it to rise by between 6.5% and 7%, up from 6.5%. It forecast total revenue from its big three business segments of legal, tax and accounting and corporates, to rise by between 8% and 8.5%, up from 8%. Reuters News revenue rose 21% to \$210 million, from the non-recurring transactions from content licensing deals related to generative AI.

Tech giants' market cap falls on Al doubts, high rates; Alphabet, Tesla gain

The market capitalisation of top technology giants fell sharply in April, pressured by diminishing enthusiasm for artificial intelligence and a scaling back of expectations for central bank interest rate cuts.

- Capital Power Corp: Scotiabank cuts target price to C\$40 from C\$45, on increased debt related to the capital cost escalations.
- CGI Inc: CIBC cuts target price to C\$165 from C\$169, referring to a weaker demand environment in certain verticals.
- **Loblaw Companies Ltd**: Scotiabank raises target price to C\$161 from C\$148.27, as its Shoppers drug mart exhibits strong structural trends.


